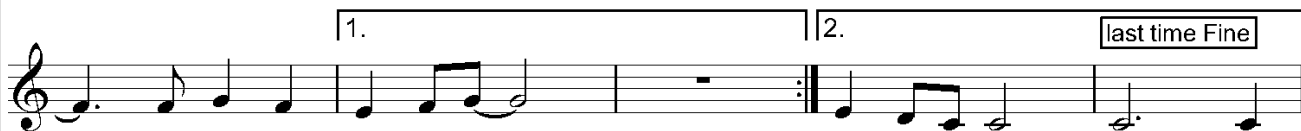

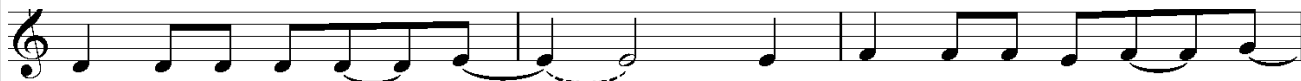

### **November 1x1x1 Project – Tuna & Feminine Hygiene Products!**

May we introduce you to our new initiative to support our Ferndale Food & Other Banks! This is called a 1x1x1 Project and it goes like this... for the month we will ask for:

## **Reconciling in Christ (RIC) Draft Welcome Statement**

Thank you to everyone who came to the RIC Q&A on Oct. 19th and those who have participated by offering feedback thus far! As a reminder...

### **What is the Welcome Statement?**

- An addition to the general welcome that is offered by Pastor Leigh at the beginning of every worship service.
- Once approved, this statement will also be found on our website with context explaining it's inception and why it's important.

### **Why do we need this?**

- To become an RIC church, one of the requirements is that we have a welcome statement that specifically names and affirms LGBTQIA+ and Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) in the church.
- Becoming an RIC congregation means living this commitment publicly - in spirit and in practice.

### **What is the Welcome Statement NOT?**

- This Welcome Statement will NOT replace the CLC Mission Statement (that reads: "We live in Christ and share God's love with all people").
- The Welcome Statement is NOT exclusionary of all other people outside of these two named groups. Even though this portion of the welcome statement specifically names LGBTQIA+ & BIPOC, it does not negate the overall welcome issued to every other person that joins worship on Sunday mornings. They are not mutually exclusive.

Below you will find the current draft RIC Welcome Statement. Starting this Sunday, the RIC Task Force will compile and review any offered feedback to this statement and adjust as they see appropriate. The Task Force will continue to meet and make adjustments if needed through the Sunday (11/9) before the Annual Meeting. The final Welcome Statement draft will be presented for a vote at the Annual Meeting on 11/16.

The most up to date draft Welcome Statement as of 10/30 is on the next page.

## ***RIC Draft Welcome Statement***

*At Christ Lutheran Church we live in Christ and share God's love with all people.*

*CLC celebrates and affirms the sacred worth of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions, including the LGBTQIA+ community; people of all cultures, ethnicities, and backgrounds; specifically Black, Indigenous, and People of Color; people of all ages and abilities; and people of all social and economic circumstances – as well as any who have experienced marginalization by the Christian Church.*

*We commit to the work of anti-racism and inclusion in a world that profits from our division. We remember Jesus' unambiguous call to love our neighbors as ourselves (Matthew 22:39).
