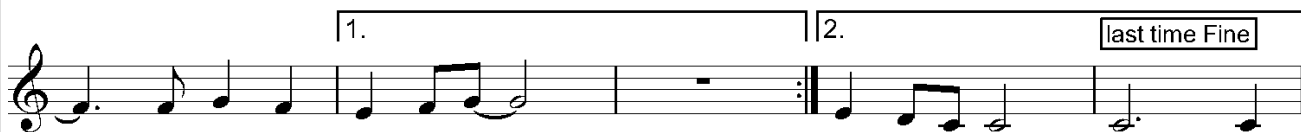

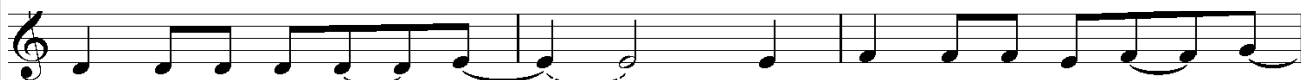



Walk and Talk - November 12th

Walkers will head west from CLC into the Seamount neighborhood, Wednesday, November 12. Be ready to depart on foot at 9:15. Street construction on Ferndale Terrace will keep that route off limits but there are a number of other streets to explore. Seamount was Ferndale's first residential “development”. The arrival of the Mobil Oil refinery west of Ferndale brought a rapid demand for housing in the mid-1950s. Modern California Ranch style homes gave a new face to housing options and the neighborhood continued to grow through ensuing decades. Seamount streets predate sidewalk development codes so walking will be along the street shoulders but traffic is generally light. Routes will accommodate a variety of walking speeds and distances and it will be an easy return to the church for hot morning beverages in the Fireside Room between 10 and 10:30.

Remember our new regular starting time is 9:15 for all who wish to gather for walking. Most of the fall and winter walks will be in or near Ferndale. There will be Coffee, tea, cocoa 10:00-10:30 in Fireside Room for anyone who wishes to enjoy a morning cup and socializing as the walkers return. Anybody is welcome! No need to be a walker, just a talker!

Reconciling in Christ (RIC) Draft Welcome Statement

Thank you to everyone who came to the RIC Q&A on Oct. 19th and those who have participated by offering feedback thus far! As a reminder...

What is the Welcome Statement?

- An addition to the general welcome that is offered by Pastor Leigh at the beginning of every worship service.
- Once approved, this statement will also be found on our website with context explaining it's inception and why it's important.

Why do we need this?

- To become an RIC church, one of the requirements is that we have a welcome statement that specifically names and affirms LGBTQIA+ and Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) in the church.
- Becoming an RIC congregation means living this commitment publicly in spirit and in practice.

What is the Welcome Statement NOT?

- This Welcome Statement will NOT replace the CLC Mission Statement (that reads: "We live in Christ and share God's love with all people").
- The Welcome Statement is NOT exclusionary of all other people outside of these two named groups. Even though this portion of the welcome statement specifically names LGBTQIA+ & BIPOC, it does not negate the overall welcome issued to every other person that joins worship on Sunday mornings. They are not mutually exclusive.

Below you will find the current draft RIC Welcome Statement. Starting this Sunday, the RIC Task Force will compile and review any offered feedback to this statement and adjust as they see appropriate. The Task Force will continue to meet and make adjustments if needed through the Sunday (11/9) before the Annual Meeting. The final Welcome Statement draft will be presented for a vote at the Annual Meeting on 11/16.

RIC Draft Welcome Statement

At Christ Lutheran Church we live in Christ and share God's love with all people.

CLC celebrates and affirms the sacred worth of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions, including the LGBTQIA+ community; people of all cultures, ethnicities, and backgrounds; specifically Black, Indigenous, and People of Color; people of all ages and abilities; and people of all social and economic circumstances – as well as any who have experienced marginalization by the Christian Church.

We commit to the work of anti-racism and inclusion in a world that profits from our division. We remember Jesus' unambiguous call to love our neighbors as ourselves (Matthew 22:39). We pray that all may encounter the living, loving God, whose grace meets us in our authentic humanity and who sees each of us as beloved.
