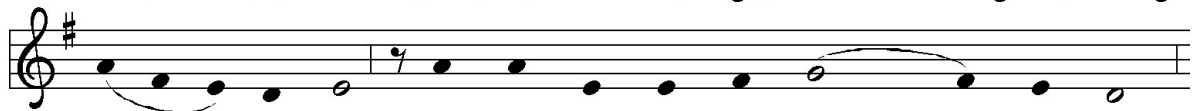

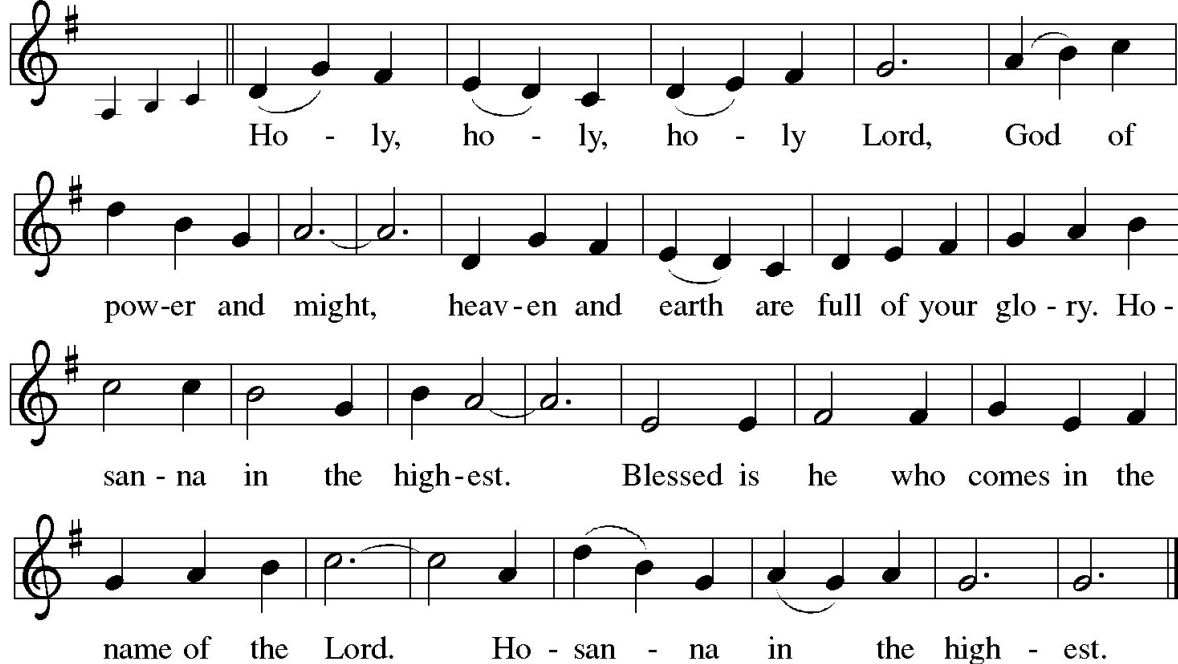

COMMUNION BY INTINCTION AND OFFERING

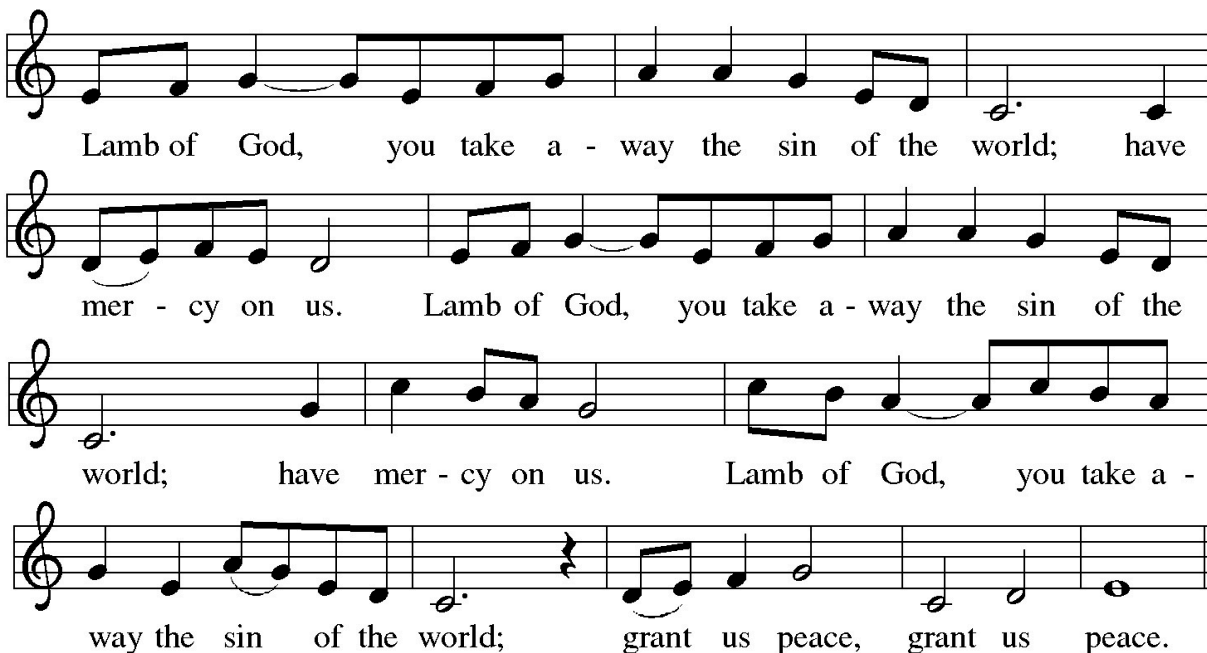
