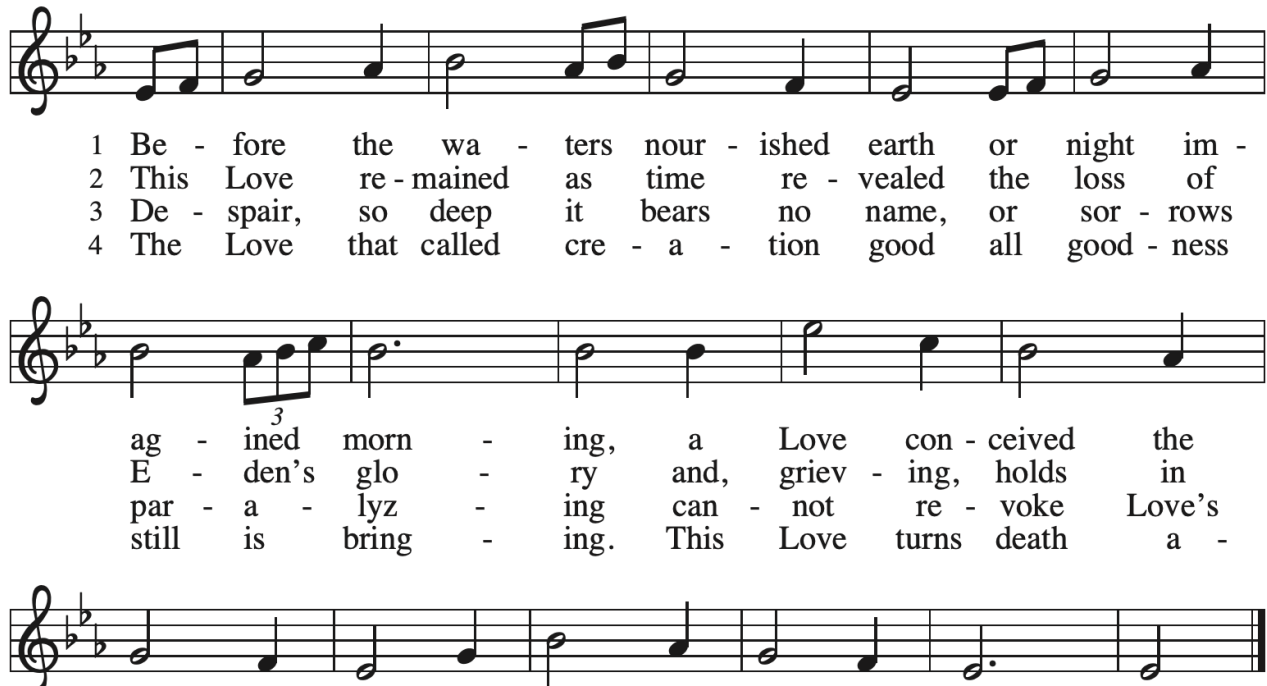

God of our ancestors,

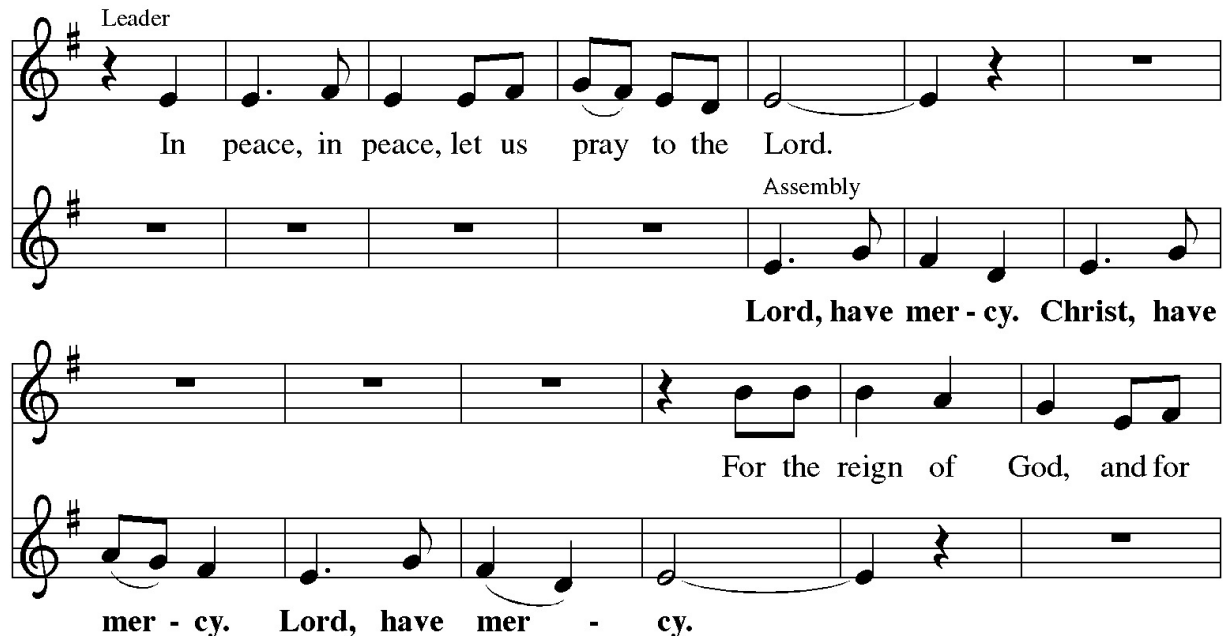
